At the March meeting, the Board also approved a slight change to the by-laws wording so it will include a broader spectrum of mapping professionals and not limit membership to property mapping. The italicized words were added. Here is how it is now worded:

The name of the organization shall be the Missouri Mappers Association. Its purpose is to bring together those persons involved in the mapping profession in the state and local governments and private industry without regard to the unit of government or department in which such persons perform their duties. The Association shall be non-profit and any dues or other funds shall be used to further the objectives of the Association.

This spring the MMA "Cooperating" member nomination for the Missouri GIS Advisory Committee (MGISAC) will be open for the next two year term. I have served two terms on this committee and it is time for the opportunity to be open to someone else from our organization. Jeff Davis from Boone County was on the committee prior to my involvement. The MGISAC is a task force that meets and acts to provide leadership and direction for the state in the development, management, and use of geographic information. Their purpose is to set standards, make the information available, and advertise the existence of geographic information. The person who accepts the MMA nomination will have voting rights as an active participant of the committee. They meet monthly, usually in Jefferson City, and help with travel expenses if necessary. There is often committee work to be completed each month between the meetings. It has been a rewarding experience. MMA needs to submit candidate names for nomination at the May 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. If you are interested in learning more, please contact me or visit the website


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### **Committee Reports**

Awards – The Awards committee would like to do some form of special recognition for the eight members who have been members for the entire twenty years. This fits in with the special recognition discussions we had during the annual meeting section. See below.

**Certification** – Numerous requests have been received for PMM information and five applications were sent out. None have been returned. The deadline will be extended if needed since the newsletter was later than anticipated.

Steve suggested that anyone passing the PMM exam in a year be offered a free registration to the annual meeting as a congratulatory incentive.

**Education** – Larry Bollinger is willing to do another workshop for the annual meeting. Brian Baker, talked to him about doing a different topic this year. They will talk in more detail on the subject. The idea about doing an "MMA Technological Success Story" workshop was discussed more in addition to the possibility of Co-sponsoring a Map Projections workshop with the St. Louis ASPRS chapter.

**Information Technology** - There has been limited activity with the IT committee since the last board meeting in October 2003, particularly since the new year began. An article was published in the January issue of MMA's newsletter summarizing the committee's activity. Our home page was decorated with Christmas holiday appropriate graphics. We have an internet email listing service set up that can be used in the future for mass mailings to members. Follow up on enrolling the members for opt-in needs to be done. More research was done on protecting member's information on our website. To implement these findings will require and organized effort on the committees part. There has not been any more discussion regarding our web page hosting services, so nothing new to report there.

**Historical** - Expenditure of \$325 was approved for Historical Committee. See last meeting minutes for more detailed information on the purchase of photo binders, storage tubs, plastic sheet covers, etc. to be co-ordinated by Marti Suiter.

### Legislative – No report

**Membership** - There are currently 65 counties paid up in MMA and 238 members. We will have to take off 45 from the membership list as they did not renew this year. The 238 is already minus the 45 unpaid ones.

**Publications** - The January newsletter went out at the end of January. We sent out approximately 280 newsletters to Members and advertisers. We had 11 advertisers in the January 2004 newsletter, which was the same amount as the October 2003 newsletter. Revenue generated by advertising was \$515, up from \$502 in October 2003. The cost of printing the January 2004 newsletter was \$192



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
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### **GIS Certification**

The GIS Certification Institute has announced the GIS Certification Program is now open to individuals to apply for the title of GIS Certified Professional (GISP).

GIS certification is career recognition through the evaluation and approval of individuals engaged in a specific occupation or profession, and it is offered by national membership associations representing numerous other career paths. The GISCI program gives recognition to professionals who demonstrate competence and integrity in the field and establish and maintain professional practices and ethical conduct.

The first class of GISCI Certified Professionals (GISPs) was announced at the URISA Annual Conference. These individuals were the successful applicants from the GISCI Pilot Program.

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### Future PMM's Take Note!!!

MMA is looking for future PMM's (Professional Missouri Mapper).

The MMA board has approved the awarding of free registration to the annual meeting for a maximum of two successful PMM candidates. In the event that more than two candidates succeed in obtaining the PMM designation a drawing will determine who wins the two free registrations.

To qualify to take the seven-

hour PMM exam, you must meet the following requirements:

1 Have five full years of cadastral mapping experience or it's equivalent.


2 Be engaged in the use, production or maintenance of maps.

3 Attend a minimum of 30 hours of study in mapping, surveying or a closely related subject (i.e. IAAO Mapping Course 600)

4 Fill out the application and drop it and the \$25 fee in the mail before February 1, 2005. (If you do not qualify to take the exam your \$25 will be returned.)

Make your plans now and apply to take the test next year. Requirements, helpful information, and application forms will be available at the 2004 Annual Meeting.


