#### Letter from the President

#### Welcome to Spring 2009!!

This President's Letter is coming to you from your MMA Vice President. Frank is recovering from a recent surgery and he has asked me to fill in for him until he returns. So, it looks like you're stuck with me for this issue.





A lot has happened since our last newsletter issue in January. Probably the most significant were Missouri Senate Bill 384 sponsored by Senator Brad Lager and the MMA Constitution & By-Law review by the Executive Board.

#### SB384:

I learned of this bill on Monday March 2, 2009 when Frank Adam forwarded it to me in an e-mail. Frank also discovered that a set of "Minimum Standards" for Missouri GIS Cadastral Mapping was in draft stages that could be used as a basis during the rule making process if Senate Bill 384 passes. These draft standards are a retooling of the Property Ownership Mapping Guidelines that were promulgated by the Missouri State Tax Commission in the early 1980's for the purpose of consistent mapping throughout the state.

After several meetings in Jefferson City, countless e-mails & telephone conversations over a five week period voicing various concerns from various organizations over the wording of the bill, SB384 was re-worded. As a result of the re-worded bill and as consistent with our vote at our April 3<sup>rd</sup> Board meeting, I submitted a letter on April 6<sup>th</sup> to Senator Lager's office that the Missouri Mappers Association supports the re-worded bill. It is my understanding that the Missouri Assessors Association and the Missouri GIS Advisory Committee also submitted letters of support of the re-worded bill.

Senate Bill 384 is available for you to review on our Web site. The "Minimum Standards" for GIS mapping is currently in draft stages and will be available to all stakeholders for input in the preparation of the final document. More details will follow.

#### **Proposed Constitution Amendment:**

The Executive Board of Directors has reviewed our Constitution and recommends two amendments to it. Our Constitution states the following:

The Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of all voting members in good standing present and voting at the annual meeting, provided that notice and a copy of any proposed amendment shall have been sent to all members by mail, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to such meetings. All proposed amendments shall be submitted to the Executive Committee for its review, no later than 60 days in advance of the annual meeting.

#### **By-Law Amendment:**

The Executive Board of Directors also reviewed our By-Laws and amended by Executive Board of Directors vote three changes to it as authorized in our Constitution. Our Constitution Article III, Section 2 states:

The governing body of the Association shall be Executive Committee and it shall have the power to pass any resolution or bylaw it may deem necessary to accomplish the objectives of the Association which is not in conflict with Continued on Page 2

Geographic information technology (GIT) has been developing in technology-centered areas, such as urban centers and academic institutions, for decades. These technology centers, however, represent a relatively small fraction of the land area in most states; certainly this is true for Missouri and Iowa. There is a critical need to have accurate and consistent information to fill in these data gaps for all stakeholders. Rural communities, however, are only recently facing the leap to geospatial technology. Unique considerations influence geospatial development and maintenance in rural communities.

As rural communities come on-line with geospatial information, more opportunities must be created for education, outreach and support. The need for basic training, management and development of geospatial programs in small, isolated communities has not been meaningfully addressed by the existing opportunities. For many rural communities, technology literacy and skill are often relatively low, and therefore understanding of technology and its merits are likewise low. Even for those with local technology skills, maintaining trained personnel is challenging due to better paying geospatial jobs in urban areas. Moreover, understanding and misunderstanding of the details of geospatial contracts (i.e. imagery, data development solutions, software licensing) has had a 'souring' effect on the willingness of some communities to engage in GIT. We propose a locally-based outreach program ('Rural GIS Summit') to focus attention on and support for underrepresented communities in the GIT landscape. PAGE 4





Editor's Note: I ran across the following article in an old edition of the newsletter. Even though a lot of us use computers for our mapping, we do still wind up from time to time working on paper maps. This article is being reprinted to help us, as well as those who are still fortunate enough to do their mapping by hand.

# Ink Tips

Did you ever start to draw out a metes and bounds description and find the distances were given in surveyor's chains? You had to wade through the legal description and multiply all your chain distances by 66 feet to determine what the dimensions in feet would be, so you could plot out the legal. Well, no need to go through all that extra multiplication if you have a surveyor's chain scale. Now you can make your own to any scale you need for almost nothing.


We made our chain scales by taking an old piece of mylar carrier strip about 1/2" x 12". The reason this works so well is because it has an adhesive on the back, which will attach to just about anything. We lay the strip out and lightly pencil on increments of 66 feet at whatever scale map we want to work on and then ink the increments, the numbers, and the scale on it. Be very careful that you place your marks accurately, and double check the overall length. Then we take the strip and pull off the protective cover to expose the adhesive and attach it to a triangle scale, or other straight edge. On a triangular scale, the strip may be attached to the 30, 50 or 60 side, which is not used frequently.

Several different scales for measuring chains may be applied to a triangular scale. We have found the surveyor's chain scale to be faster and easier to work with than converting dimensions in chains to feet. So, next time you get a deed using chains, don't reach for a calculator. Reach for your new surveyor's chain scale.




