PMM CERTIFICATION

Have you ever wondered how you measure up in the Mapping field? Are you a **good** Mapper or a **great** Mapper?

It is "that time of year" for anyone who is interested in taking the PMM exam to review their Mapping Course 6 books and to practice their inking skills!

To qualify to take the seven-hour PMM exam, you must meet the following requirements:

Have five full years of cadastral mapping experience or it's equivalent.

Be engaged in the use, production or maintenance of maps.

Attend a minimum of 30 hours of study in mapping, surveying or a closely related subject (i.e. IAAO Mapping Course 600 or 601.)

Fill out the application and drop it and the \$25 fee in the mail before February 1, 2004. (If you do not qualify to take the exam your \$25 will be returned.)

Your application will be reviewed by the Certification Committee to verify that you are a member in good standing of the Missouri Mappers Association and that you meet the qualifications to take the exam. The exam will be given in late March or early April at a time and location that is convenient for the applicants.

Update from the Legislative Committee


Senate Bill 875 was pre filed by Sen. Caskey and co-sponsor Sen. Childers on 12/01/03 please see the text of bill below. There is a companion bill ready to file in the House by Representatives Crawford and Sutherland, with several co-sponsors. I have meet with the School Administrators Excessive Committee or representatives on several occasion this summer, unfortunately we have not worked out any kind of compromised at this point.

SB 875 - This act modifies the percentage of property tax collections that are deposited in the county assessment fund. It increases the percentage from one-half of one percent to one percent in first class counties and St. Louis City. For second, third, and fourth class counties the percentage becomes two percent, up from one-and one half percent in second class counties and one percent in third and fourth class counties.

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
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Annual Meeting Report
