REPORT FROM THE ANNUAL MEETING MISSOURI MAPPERS ASSOCIATION AUGUST 12, 1987

The Annual General Membership meeting of Missouri Mappers Association was called to order by Vice-President Don Cleveland at 10:55 a.m., August 12, 1987 at the Holiday Inn Executive Center, Columbia, Missouri. The following Board members were in attendance: Vice-President, Don Cleveland; Secretary, Mary Ann

Kaiser; Treasurer, Ken Eftink; Directors, Robert Pirrie and Gary Drennan. In addition, forty-six members were present. There were no guests.

MINUTES

The minutes of the 1986 Annual Meeting held August 5, 1986 were read by Secretary Mary Ann Kaiser. Motion was made by Robert Pirrie and seconded by James Matlock that minutes be approved as read. Motion was carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer Ken Eftink reported that Treasury balance as of January 1, 1987 was \$4,283.65. The balance at the present time is \$4,230.19. Treasurer Eftink knows of no outstanding bills with the exception of these directly related to the Annual Meeting which is currently underway. The reported current balance also does not include the receipts for registrations for the Annual Meeting. Motion was made by Gary Drennan and seconded by Don Hallemeier that the Treasurer's Report be accepted as presented by Treasurer Eftink. The motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Education Committee

The Education Committee report was presented by Committee Chairman Bob Norris. The stated goals of the Education Committee for this year were to further the educational program by:

- 1. sponsoring an aerial photography workshop
- 2. sponsoring Course 6
- 3. preparing a mapping manual.

Mr. Norris reported that the Aerial Photography Workshop is being held in conjunction with the current Annual Meeting, the Course 6 is scheduled for October 5-9 in Springfield, Missouri and work has begun on the Mapping Manual. The process of completing the manual will require additional time, perhaps as much as another year.

Publications Committee

The report of the Publications Committee was presented by Committee Chairman Joe Martin. Several newsletters have been published during the past year and the next newsletter is scheduled for publication approximately September 1. It will include coverage of the Annual Meeting.

Membership Committee

The report of the Membership Committee was presented by Vice-President Don Cleveland. He reported in December, 1985 there were 240 members, August, 1986 there were 280 members, and there presently are 206 members. New membership applications have been prepared and Mr. Cleveland encouraged all members to take these forms and distribute them. He reported that annual dues are currently payable and many have been included in the payments for the registration for the Annual Meeting. He also reported that proposed changes to the Constitution relating to membership classifications will be discussed as Old Business.

Legislative Committee

There was no report from the Legislative Committee. However, Robert Pirrie, who is on the Legislative Committee for MARLS, reviewed with the membership the following proposed MARLS legislation, which may be of interest to the Missouri Mappers Association.

 Mandatory plat recording.
 This would require all new surveys regardless of size to be recorded in the County Recorder's Office.

- 2. Legislation to permit Circuit Courts to judicate section corners
- 3. An update of Chapter 60, which deals County Surveyors. Mr. Pirrie said that under the new Minimum Standards issued recently by the Department of Natural Resources, spot surveys can no longer be performed legally. Previously the Minimum Standards allowed for a waiver of some conditions but this has been removed from the new Minimum Standards.

Certification Committee

The Certification Committee report was presented by Committee Chairman Stan Balsman. He said that there are currently 10 Professional Missouri Mappers. During the past year, the Committee has been in the process of establishing guidelines. The PMM test was given and although 5 members requested applications only one was submitted. The test was successfully passed by Debra Cochran and her PMM certificate was presented by Stan Balsman at this time. Our congratulations to Debbie for her ambition and quality work in the mapping profession that reflects in her attaining the designation of Professional Missouri Mapper.

Annual Meeting Committee

Committee Chairman, Mary Ann Kaiser, reported that there are 65 paid registrants and 10 exhibitors at the meeting.

Awards Committee

Committee Chairman, Bob Pirrie, reported that a new award - The Outstanding Mapper of the Year, has been initiated this year. This award along with the Educational Award and the Fireball Award will be presented later in the meeting.

Committee Reports

A motion was made by Jack McDermott and seconded by Larry Hixson that committee reports be accepted as given. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Constitution

Vice-President Cleveland reviewed the proposed constitution amendments, which have previously been approved by the Executive Committee and circulated to the General Membership in accordance with Article VII, Sections I and II. They were presented to the Executive Committee on June 10, 1987 and mailed to the general membership on July 21, 1987. The purpose of the Amendment is to clarify the classifications on members. A copy of the proposed Amendments as presented is attached to the minutes. A motion was made Glen Nicoll and seconded by Steve Kock that the constitution be amended as presented and further that all references to associate members be deleted. Motion carried.

Newsletter Responses

In the Fall of 1986, the Executive Committee prepared a Membership Survey Questionnaire which was included in the newsletter. In an attempt to encourage participation by the members, cash awards to be given away on a drawing basis at the 1987 Annual Meeting were proposed. NEW BUSINESS

Election of Officers

"THE LITE TABLE"

There Oughta Be a Law.

The following ''legal'' description was recorded in Butler County in April of this year. Note that it is a ''simple'' quarter-quarter description that requires you to read at least 21 other deed references to determine what, if anything, is being transferred.

All of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 10, except 5 acres lying west of Cane Creek, and all of the south half of the southwest quarter of section 11, and the north half of the northwest quarter of section 14, township 24 north, range 5 east, containing 195 acres, more or less, Butler County, Missouri, LESS AND EXCEPT THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED TRACTS:

Except land described in General Warranty Deed, Book 596, p. 936

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERALS OPINION ON MAPPERS PRACTICING SURVEYING

This opinion is in response to the question asking:

Whether or not cadastral mapping by the Missouri Tax Commission and the County Assessors constitutes the practice of land surveying as defined in the statutes?

Cadastral, when referring to maps or surveys, is defined as showing or recording property boundaries, subdivision lines, buildings and other details. See Webster's Third New International Dictionary.

Chapter 327, RSMo 1986, provides for the registration of land surveyors. Section327.281, RSMo 1986, provides:

327.281. Unauthorized practice prohibited. -- No person, including any duly elected county surveyor, shall practice as a land surveyor in Missouri as defined in section 327.272 unless and until there is issued to him a certificate of registration or a certificate of authority certifying that he has been duly registered as a land surveyor in Missouri, and unless such certificate has been renewed as hereinafter specified.

Section 327.272, RSMo 1986, which defines practice as a land surveyor, provides:

Section 327.272. Practice as land surveyor defined. --Any person practices in Missouri as a "land surveyor" who renders or offers to render, or holds himself out as willing or able to render, any service comprising the determination of the location of land boundaries and land boundary corners, the preparation of maps showing the shape and area of tracts of land and their subdivisions into smaller tracts and showing access thereto, or the preparation of official plats, or maps, of said land in this state; or who uses the title "registered land surveyor" or "land surveyor" or the word "surveyor" alone or preceded by any word indicating or implying that he is or holds himself out to be a land surveyor, or who shall by word or letters, figures, degrees, titles, or other description indicate or imply that he is a land surveyor or is willing or able to practice land surveying.

Chapter 137, RSMo 1986, provides the statutory scheme for the assessment of property for purposes of taxation. Section 137.185, RSMo 1986, provides:

Section 137.185. Tracts less than one-sixteenth of a section. -- 1. In all cases where any person. . .may. . divide any tract of land into parcels less than one-sixteenth part of a section or otherwise, in such manner that such parcels cannot be described in the usual manner of describing lands in accordance with the surveys made by the general government, it shall be the duty of such person. . . to cause such lands to be surveyed and a plat thereof made by a surveyor. . . which plat shall particularly describe and set forth the lots of parcels of land surveyed, as aforesaid; . . . provided, that whenever. . . tracts of parcels of land less than one-sixteenth of a section. . outside of the limits of any incorporated city. . . have been conveyed without having been surveyed and platted. . .as herein provided; the (county) commission may require the county surveyor. . . to survey and plat such. . . tracts of land. . .at the expense of the owner of such tracts of land.

Section 137.205, RSMo 1986, provides:

137.205. Assessor to have free access to plats and maps -- board to compare -- omissions. -- The assessor shall have free access to all landplats and maps during the time of assessment with a view to ascertain what lands are taxable; and upon the return of the assessor's books to the board of equalization, the said board shall compare that same with the plats and maps of the county; and in all cases where any lands have been omitted by the assessor, they shall be placed in the assessor's books and assessed as other lands are required to be assessed by this chapter. Section 137.210, RSMo 1986, provides:

137.210. Assessor to examine and compare lists --assessor's book. -- The assessor shall examine and compare the list of property delivered by individuals with the plats and maps, and after diligent efforts to ascertain all taxable property in his county shall make a complete list of all the real and tangible personal property taxable by his county to be called the assessor's book.

Section 137.215, RSMo 1986, provides for the assessor's book to be divided into two parts, one of which shall be "the land list." See also Section 137.220, RSMo 1986.

also Section 137.220, RSMo 1986.
Section 138.410, RSMo 1986, provides for the State Tax Commission to exercise general supervision over all the assessing officers of this state. Such section provides in part:

138.410. General supervision -- attorney general and prosecuting attorney to assist in enforcement. -- 1. The commission shall exercise general supervision over all the assessing officers of this state, over county boards of equalization and appeal in the performance of their duties under this chapter and all other laws concerning the general property tax and shall institute proper proceedings to enforce the penalties and liabilities provided by law for public officers, officers of corporations and individuals failing to comply with the provisions of this chapter, and of all laws relating to the general property tax.

In State ex rel. Cassilly v. Riney. 576 S.W.2d 325 (Mo. banc 1979), the Missouri Supreme Court interpreted this section as providing the State Tax Commission has the duty, responsibility and right to exercise general supervision over all county assessing offices and the county boards of equalization. The court further stated the commission has powers commensurate with its responsibility.

The key issue appears to be whether Section 327.281 prohibits the Missouri State Tax Commission and county assessors from engaging in cadastral mapping without using the services of a registered land surveyor.

In 1968, this office faced a similar issue with respect to county surveyors. At that time, Section 344.020, RSMo 1959, provided:

It shall be unlawful for any person to practice, or offer to practice, or to in any manner advertise or indicate to the public that he is engaged in, or will engage in the practice of land surveying in this state, without first registering with the state board of registration for architects and professional engineers, as a land surveyor.

This office in 1968 opined that county surveyors when duly qualified may perform surveys for the general public within the county for which they were elected without being a duly registered

land surveyor. Missouri Attorney General Opinion No. 146, Niewoehner, 1968 (now withdrawn). Our opinion was based in part on **Hayes v. City of Kansas City**, 241 S.W.2d 888 (Mo. 1951) wherein the court stated:

(6) "The state and its agencies are not to be considered as within the purview of a statute, however general and comprehensive the language of such act may be, unless an intention to include them is clearly manifest, as where they are expressly named therein, or included by necessary implication. . . ."

Id. at 892. In 1969, the General Assembly repealed Section 344.020, RSMo 1959, and enacted Section 327.281. Such section as enacted in 1969 provided:

No person, including any duly elected county surveyor, shall practice as a land surveyor in Missouri as defined in section 327.272 unless and until the board has issued to him a certificate of registration or a certificate of authority certifying that he has been duly registered as a land surveyor in Missouri, and unless such certificate has been renewed each year as hereinafter specified.

(Emphasis added.) **See** Missouri Attorney General Opinion No. 405, Caskey, 1971 and Missouri Attorney General Opinion No. 96, Myers, 1972, copies of which are enclosed.

Based upon the principle set forth in **Hayes v. City of Kansas City, supra**, and the reasoning in the opinions referenced above, We conclude the Missouri State Tax Commission and county assessors can engage in land surveying to the extent necessary to perform their duties under the law. If cadastral mapping is necessary for them to perform their duties, they may do so without being registered as land surveyors in Missouri.

CONCLUSION

It is the opinion of this office that the Missouri State Tax Commission and county assessors can engage in cadastral mapping to the extent necessary to perform their duties under the law without being registered as land surveyors in Missouri.
