

Keynote Speaker: Rep. Mike Sutherland, 92nd General Assembly Getting Involved With Your Government

Mike Sutherland, a Republican, represents part of Montgomery and Warren counties (District 99), in the Missouri House of Representatives. He was elected to the House in November 2002. He serves as vice-chair of Tax Policy, Appropriations-General Administration, Senior Security, and General Laws. In addition to his legislative duties, Rep. Sutherland is a farmer. He also served as Warren County Assessor from 1996 to 2002 and was a newspaper editor in Warrenton, Bowling Green and St. Charles, Missouri.

Rep. Sutherland is a member of the following organizations: Farm Bureau, former county board member; Missouri Pork Producers, former county and state board member; Warren County Cattlemen's Association; Wright City Chamber of Commerce; Montgomery City Chamber of Commerce; Warrenton Rotary Club; Warren County Fair Youth Livestock Show volunteer; Warren County Young Republican Club, chairman and charter member; Warren County Republican Central Committee, past treasurer; Central East Missouri Assessor's Association, past chairman; St. Charles Child Assessment Center, board member; Missouri Corn Growers Association and the National Rifle Association. Sutherland received a bachelor of science degree in Mass Communications from Central Missouri State University in 1988. Born April 8, 1965 in Columbia, Mo., Rep. Gary Morgan, Information Services Director for Taney County Missouri County GIS/GPS Fundamentals — From Planning to Implementation!

Starting a County wide GIS can appear to be an overwhelming task - who do you turn to for assistance? This presentation will discuss how Taney County developed their county base map, how it is maintained, how new layers of data are created, and how they use GPS as a tool to create additional data sets for their GIS. Outside funding for a GIS and aerial mapping will also be discussed.

Gary Morgan is the Information Services Director for Taney County Missouri. Their IS Department is also responsible for GIS Projects. Gary has been with Taney County since 1994. In 1997, he became Taney County's Deputy Assessor, and moved to his current position in January 2000. He was a member of the initial GIS concept committee in 1997 that planned the future of Taney County's GIS. He has presented at the Missouri GIS Conference, the Mid-America GIS Symposium, and at various community events concerning GIS. He currently serves as co-chair for the Tri-Lakes Area GIS Users Group.



Charlie Magruder, Midwest Regional Manager, NovaLIS Technologies GIS & CAMA: Seven Levels of Integration for Success

Learning Objectives:

Attendees will gain a deeper understanding of GIS integration

Provides a viable set of definitions for levels of integration

Assesses integration types, implementation characteristics, costs, and rewards of achieving integration

Integration is a term used by many to express often very divergent outcomes. The definitions and limitations placed on the word integration vary as greatly as the levels of integration their definer achieves between systems.

Using specific examples from the community, this paper will focus on setting and meeting goals for integration of GIS. It will address this issue by imparting clear definitions for various levels of integration that can be used as benchmarks for the term. Attendees will go away with a better understanding of the types of integration possible between computer systems. It will also enable them to better assess the type of solution they have or plan to pursue, by establishing a target to strive towards in system integration.

Charlie serves as the NovaLIS Midwest Regional Sales Manager, overseeing opportunities for the Midwest region. Charlie has been directly involved with state and local government sales for the past 10 years. Prior to joining NovaLIS, Charlie spent over seven years with ESRI. He served as a regional sales rep working mainly in the State & Local government sector. In addition to sales and marketing experience, Charlie has also taught introductory level Desktop Mapping applications and ArcIMS classes. Charlie holds a Bachelor of Arts in Geography and a minor in Cartography from Kent State University.

How and where to acquire historical land records, evaluating the research and their applications to improve the accuracy of your base maps. The discussion will include an explanation of the value of historical land records, the use of surveys to improve your base map accuracy and simple techniques used by surveyors in interpreting and developing accurate base maps.



What is the Missouri Mappers Association?

The Missouri Mappers Association is a non-profit organization. Its purpose is to bring together those persons concerned with property mapping in state and local governments and private industry, and to create a framework in which we may cooperate in the investigation, study, discussion, and recommendation of improvements in property mapping and land record management, to promote the interchange of ideas and experiences, to improve the practice of property mapping and knowledge through education and training, and to support legislation beneficial to property mappers and land record management.

To achieve these objectives, the Association sponsors regional workshops and courses, publishes a quarterly newsletter, and has instituted a professional designation program.

MMA operates from a constitution and a set of by-laws. The Association has an Executive committee comprised of a President, Immediate Past President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and two Directors. These officers are selected each year at the Annual Meeting with the exception of the Treasurer and the Directors who each serve a two-year term of office.

Each year, the President appoints several standing committees. These include Annual Meeting, Awards, Certification, Education, Legislation, Membership, Publication, Historical, and CADD.

The **Annual Meeting Committee** oversees all of the many responsibilities for the annual membership meetings. They endeavor to provide the membership with an enlightening, rewarding, and entertaining gathering.

The **Awards Committee** has the difficult task of choosing the recipients for the awards that are presented each year at the Annual Meeting.

The **Certification Committee** is responsible for administrating the Professional Missouri Mapper (PMM) designation program. To acquire designation, candidates must have a certain amount of experience, education, and complete a comprehensive mapping examination.

The **Education Committee** works to furnish educational opportunities by providing regional workshops which are held several times each year throughout the state.

The **Legislation Committee** keeps apprised of any current legislation that involves mapping and informs the membership of such. Members are on occasion asked to notify their legislators in support of or opposition to proposed legislation.



The **Membership Committee** is constantly working to bring new members into the organization. They maintain the membership records and publish a membership directory annually.

The **Publication Committee** produces the MMA News, a quarterly newsletter that contains informative, educational, and entertaining tidbits.

The *Information Technology Committee* promotes the use of CADD and assists with training programs on the use of computerized data in the mapping profession.

The *Historical Committee* is responsible for accumulating information about MMA and for preserving these records for future memberships.

MGISAC

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) represent a valuable asset that can be useful to many people and organizational entities. Producing, analyzing and assessing computerized maps showing the location of highways, utilities, natural resources, and the distribution of specific populations are among the many uses of GIS. To maximize the benefits that can be realized through GIS, it is important that all geographic information adhere to standards that ensure data interoperability and that provide adequate documentation for data consumers to make judgements as to its utility. It is also important that the information be made available to interested parties as a sharable state asset. To accomplish these objectives, a statewide committee consisting of GIS professionals as well as other interested persons representing local, state, academic, regional, and federal organizations was created.

Direction for GI/GIT leadership and coordination is provided by the Office of Information Technology (OIT) which has been very supportive of the growth in GIT. The Missouri GIS Advisory Committee was established under the OIT and is the leading coordination body for GIT in Missouri. Support for this group is provided by the Missouri Spatial Data Information Service (MSDIS), a state-funded center located within the Department of Geography at the University of Missouri with the purpose of providing archival and distribution services for digital geographic information to the many users in Missouri.

While not established by Gubernatorial or Legislative actions, the MGISAC was established as a standing committee under the OIT. Its purposes are: to foster cooperation among state agencies, local governments, private industry, academia, federal government and others in the field of Geographic Information Technologies; to advise and assist the OIT in the coordination and advancement of GI technology in Missouri State Government; to develop and recommend GIT management procedures and goals for state government as outlined in the Missouri GIS Strategic Management Plan; to assure the highest quality of information and reduce unnecessary duplication in the application of GIS technology; to provide a forum for interaction among state government agencies and other stakeholders with regard to policies and standards on the development and uses of GIS; and to enhance the recognition of GIS at the local, state and federal levels through the sharing of GIS products and research findings.

MGISAC has several roles, including providing direction and oversight to the MSDIS, developing and publishing standards, representing the state at national meetings and events, facilitating a State Mapping Advisory Committee, hosting an annual statewide GIS conference, coordinating database development, and providing a forum for the state's broad GI community. MGISAC by-laws and work plans are posted on the MSDIS web site. The work plan addresses the following four activity areas and goals:

- Maintain and expand the spatial data archive.
- Set database and computer standards for the GIS user community.
- Expand the use of GIS technology in Missouri Government.
- Plan MSDIS activities and report regularly on progress.

Constitution of the Missouri Mappers Association

The name of this organization shall be the Missouri Mappers Association. Its purpose is to bring together those persons concerned with property mapping in the state and local governments and private industry without regard to the unit of government or department in which such persons perform their duties. The Association shall be non-profit and any dues or other funds shall be used to further the objectives of the Association.

ARTICLE I - OBJECTIVES

Section 1 To create a frame work in which the various governmental units of Missouri and others may cooperate in the investigation, study, discussion, and recommendation of improvement in property mapping and land record management.

Section 2 To provide a forum in which officials of various agencies of state and local governments and others concerned with property mapping may address common problems.

Section 3 To provide a means whereby property mappers and other interested property mapping may interchange ideas and experiences and obtain advice.

Section 4 To advance property mapping knowledge and practice through education.

Section 5 To encourage a high standard of experience as a means to more effectively serve the public.

Section 6 To work toward the improvement of the technical quality of property maps available to the government.

Section 7 To support legislation beneficial to property mappers and land record management.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP

Section I Regular Members: Mappers, mapping supervisors, department heads in charge of mapping, and those directly involved shall be entitled to regular membership.

Section 2 Subscribing Members: Persons or firms not eligible for regular membership that are interested in property mapping.

Section 3 Student Members: Students at a university, college, trade or other equally recognizable school, not eligible for regular membership, that are interested in property mapping.



Section 4 Rejection: The right to reject any application for membership is hereby reserved for the Executive Committee.

Section 5 Voting Rights: The right to hold office and vote is open to all members in good standing, with the exception of student members.

Section 6 Transfer of Membership: Whenever the dues of a member are paid by an employer, and the member resigns, retires or other wise vacates the position during the period for which the dues have been paid; the membership may be transferred to the successor upon receipt of written notice to the Association by said employer.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

Selection: At each annual meeting there shall be elected for the term of one (1) year, by the membership in good standing who are present, a President, a Vice-President, and a Secretary. The Treasurer and two (2) Directors shall be elected for a term of two (2) years, by the membership in good standing who are present, with (1) Director being elected each year. Beginning in 1988, one (1) Director shall be elected for a full two (2) year term and one (1) Director shall be elected for a half, one (1) year term. One Director shall be elected each year thereafter, so that the terms of the Directors shall be staggered.

Section 2 Executive Committee Members: The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, the Immediate Past President, Secretary, Treasurer and Directors. The President shall be the chairperson of the Executive Committee and may call a committee together in the interest of the Association at his or her discretion or upon written request of three (3) committee members. The governing body of the Association shall be the Executive Committee and it shall have the power to pass any resolution or bylaw it may deem necessary to accomplish the objectives of the Association, which is not in conflict with any of the provisions of this constitution or resolutions or bylaws adopted in meeting of the Association. The Executive Committee shall approve the budgets for all committees, and these budgets shall not exceed without the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 3 Quorum: For the purpose of transacting official business, a quorum of the Executive Committee shall consist of not less than four (4) members thereof.

Section 4 Vacancy of Offices: Whenever a vacancy in the Executive Committee shall occur, the Nominating Committee shall appoint a voting member in good standing to fill the vacancy, who shall serve until the next annual meeting, provided when a vacancy occurs in the office of the President, the Vice-President, shall immediately succeed thereto.

<u>Section 5</u> Compensation: Officers and Directors shall serve without compensation, except the reasonable expense to attend special meetings, may be approved by the Executive Committee.



ARTICLE IV - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1 President: The President shall be the Chairperson, and preside at all general association meetings and executive meetings and executive committee meetings, or designate the Vice-President, in his or her absence or another member of the Executive Committee.

The President shall have power to appoint regular or special committees, as he or she may deem necessary.

Section 2 Vice-President: The Vice-President shall exercise all the powers and duties of the President during his or her absences or inability to act and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Executive Committee. The Vice-President shall also act as coordinator of the Standing Committee.

Secretary: The Secretary shall keep roll of all members of the Association and a true up-to-date record of all proceedings of the Association and meeting of the Executive Committee, subject to the inspection and approval of the Executive Committee, which shall be turned over to his or her immediate successor in office.

Section 4 Treasurer: The Treasurer shall be the chief financial agent of the Association and shall exercise such authority and perform such duties of the Association as may be prescribed by the Executive Committee. The Treasurer shall have custody of all funds, securities, and legal instruments of the Association and shall be responsible for their safekeeping. To this end the Treasurer may, subject to approval of the Executive Committee, determine the place and manner of depositing and safekeeping of such funds, securities, and legal instruments. A correct account for all receipts and distributions must be kept and a complete up-to-date report submitted at each annual meeting. The Executive Committee shall have full rights to examine and cause an audit to be made at any time.

<u>Section 5</u> Directors: The Directors shall help guide the Association to achieve its objectives by their involvement in the Executive Committee. They shall serve on the Executive Committee with the same voting rights as the other officers.

ARTICLE V - NOMINATIONS & ELECTIONS

Section 1 Nominations & Elections: The President shall appoint each year a Nomination Committee consisting of three (3) voting members in good standing who shall select at least one (1) name from the membership, in good standing, as a candidate for each office and make the necessary report at each annual meeting.

Section 2 Additional nominations for each office may be made from the floor at any annual meeting, by any voting member in good standing.

Section 3 Officers shall be elected by majority vote at the annual meeting.



ARTICLE VI - MEETINGS

<u>Section 1</u> The Association shall hold its annual General meetings at which time the election and installation of officers shall take place. The Executive Committee shall have authority to call special meetings at such time it deems necessary.

<u>Section 2</u> Notice: Notice of the annual and any such special meetings shall be given to all members by mail, not less than 15 days prior to such meetings. Notice shall state the date, time and place of the meeting, along with an agenda of business to be conducted.

Section 3 Quorum: Any business, including the election of the officers, can be transacted by a majority of the voting membership in good standing who are present.

ARTICLE VII – AMENDMENTS

<u>Section 1</u> This constitution may be amended by a majority vote of all voting members in good standing present and voting at the annual meeting, provided that notice and a copy of any proposed amendment shall have been sent to all members by mail, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to such meetings.

<u>Section 2</u> All proposed amendments shall be submitted to the Executive Committee for its review, no later than 60 days in advance of the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VIII - DEFINITION OF "PROPERTY MAPPING"

PROPERTY MAPPING is compilation or representation of cadastral information from the primary sources of deeds, surveys, plats, and base maps for the purpose of creating a graphic representation of land ownership, within a governmental unit for assessments, zoning or other purposes.

The information developed from property mapping may be used as a basis for further investigation into primary sources of deeds, plats, and surveys, but does not serve as a substitute for the primary sources of cadastral mapping.



MMA Bylaws

Committees

The President shall appoint the following committees each year.

Annual Dues

The annual dues shall be \$15.00 for regular members, \$25.00 for subscribing members, and \$5.00 for student members.

Time of Annual Meeting

The Associations Annual Meeting shall be held at the discretion of the Executive Committee.

Fiscal Year

The Association's Fiscal Year shall begin August 1 and close on July 31 of each year.

Approve of Expenditures

The President and Treasurer shall approve all Association expenditures.

Chapters

The Associations, with the approval of its Board of Directors, may authorize and chapter local chapters consolidate chapters or revoke chapter charters for good cause. Chapters shall coextensive in geographical area, application for the charter of a chapter shall be in writing, signed by not fewer than ten (10) members in good standing, and shall be submitted to the Board of Directors of the Missouri Mappers Association for its approval.

Such local chapters may provide for their internal government and regulations by Bylaws which shall not be in conflict with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Association and which shall be submitted to the Board of Directors of the Association for its approval. Each local chapter is required to have its chairperson or a chapter member, as designated by the chairperson of such chapter, in attendance at each quarterly meeting and give a report to the Board of Directors.

Amendments

These Bylaws may be amended by vote of the Executive Committee, as provided by Article III, Section 2, of the Constitution.



Professional Missouri Mapper (PMM)

A. Introduction

"A profession is a body of people who carry on their work in accordance with rules designed to enforce certain standards both for the protection of its members and for better service to the public." Mapping, like other professions, requires special study, knowledge, and skill. The Missouri Mappers Association has instituted a program designed to raise the professional standards of mapping personnel, and recognize those superior skills. The professional designation outlined is a result of this effort.

Attainment of the Professional Missouri Mapper (PMM) Designation is a true challenge. IN addition to ability, it requires a substantial amount of study and knowledge. Those who achieve this difficult goal should be very proud; there are some who will fail. Yet, if this were not so, the designation would not be worth the time, effort, and patience required to obtain it.

B. Objectives

Realizing that fair and equitable administration of property mapping requires a high level of competence in many areas, the Missouri Mappers Association has instituted the PMM designation. The PMM designation is designed for those professionals who are engaged in the use, production, or maintenance of cadastral maps.

The program is designed to raise the standards of the mapping profession, to attain recognition by governmental authorities and the public of the mapping profession, and to gain for members recognition as qualified, objective and competent mapping professionals.

C. Administration

The Professional Certification Committee administers the PMM program. This committee will be made up of Professional Missouri Mappers in good standing, consisting of a Chairman appointed by the President of the Missouri Mappers Association and 4 members appointed by the Chairman. If the board liaison is a PMM he or she may serve on this committee as on of the 4 members. The duties of the Professional Certification Committee are to prescribe the policy regarding the applicants requirements, to screen all applicants, to prepare suitable examinations, and to recommend to the Executive Board individuals qualified to receive the Professional Designation.



D. Candidate Application Requirements for the PMM Designation

Applicant **must** be a member in good standing of the Missouri Mappers Association and must make formal application for candidacy. These applications are available from the Committee Chairman.

Applicant must submit a candidacy application form with appropriate fee.

E. PMM Designation Requirements

To qualify as a Professional Missouri Mapper a person shall complete all of the requirements listed below. The minimum requirements for PMM designation are:

Have five (5) full years of cadastral mapping experience or its equivalent.

Be engaged in the use, production or maintenance of maps.

Attended a minimum of 30 hours of study in mapping, surveying or a closely related subject.

Successfully complete a certification examination, which will be established and revised when necessary by the Certification Committee.

F. Certification Examination

A validated examination is necessary to test the applicants knowledge of cadastral mapping principles and techniques. The examination for PMM requires seven hours to complete and is composed of three parts briefly described as follows:

Part I (1 hour & 15 minutes)

A 90 question comprehensive, multiple choice and true/false test that will test your general knowledge of mapping worth 100 points.

Part II (4 hours & 30 minutes)

A 16 question, 200-point compilation exercise designed to test your analytical and technical abilities.

Part III (1 hour & 15 minutes)

A 50-point inking exercise designed to test your craftsmanship and skill.

A score of 70% or 245 points out of a possible 350 shall be required to pass.



The examination may only be taken once within any 12-month period only after all other requirements have been met. It may be given in more than one location on the same day depending on the need and location of the applicants. The Certification Committee will determine the time and locations. Efforts will be made to give the examination in location convenient to the candidates.

G. Awarding the Designation

The candidate shall assert by affidavit, that if designated, he or she will abide by the MMA bylaws and the requirements of the Professional Missouri Mappers Program. After the candidate completes all requirements for the Professional Designation, the Executive Board on the recommendation of the Certification Committee, will award the appropriate designation.

H. Evidence of Designation

Each PMM designee will receive a certificate of designation issued by the MMA as approved by the Executive Board.

I. Use of the Professional Designation - PMM

Members of the Missouri Mappers Association who have been awarded the PMM Designation may identify themselves by their designation. PMM is the abbreviation for the title of Professional Missouri Mapper (it should be noted that the abbreviation does not have periods between the letters.) In the event that the designation of an individual is terminated by resignation, expulsion or for any other reason and also during any period that an individual's privileges of membership or designation are suspended for any reason the individual shall refrain from using or displaying the designation PMM.

The PMM Certification of Designation and other such evidence of the designation issued at any time to a member of the Missouri Mappers Association, shall remain the permanent property of the Missouri Mappers Association and must be returned to the Executive Board of the individual to whom such materials are issued is suspended or terminated for any reason.

J. Maintaining Certification

In order to maintain a high level of professionalism, it is necessary for professional designees to keep abreast of the ever-changing mapping field. In order to maintain the PMM designation, the following will be necessary:

Maintain active membership in the Missouri Mappers Association.

Accumulate a minimum of 10 points within a 12-month period and keep a record format designation by the Certification Committee in accordance with the PMM Certification Requirement.




