Working with the Esri Land Records Solution in ArcGIS 10

8:30 A.M. - 11:30 A.M.

Room A

In ArcGIS 10, a new Land Records Solution has been introduced. The Land Records Solution includes a Parcel Editor toolbar, which is available with an ArcEditor or ArcInfo license. The toolbar works with a Parcel Fabric dataset, which is a new data model for the storage, maintenance, and editing of parcels in the Geodatabase. This session will cover the parcel fabric data model and how the Parcel Editing Toolbar can be used to support common parcel maintenance workflows. The hands-on portion of the workshop will leverage the land records templates available from ArcGIS.com which are based on the parcel data model.

Presenters: Tim Hensley and Lindsay Hunter-Tracy, Esri

Tim Hensley has been with Esri since 1998, focusing primarily on GIS solutions pertaining to the World Wide Web. He has significant experience with both ArcGIS Server and ArcIMS. But, he is also well versed in Esri's Desktop and SDE technologies. Over the years, Mr. Hensley has developed several web solutions pertaining to Esri Server solutions, most notable of which is the User-Friendly Real Estate/CAMA Application, a.k.a. URECA. Prior to joining Esri, Mr. Hensley worked at both the State and County levels of Government within Kansas, where he still has family and many friends.

Lindsay Hunter-Tracy graduated from Southern Illinois University Edwardsville with a Bachelor of Science and Master's Degree in Business Administration. She has been an Account Manager with Esri for four years. During her career at Esri, she has worked specifically with County and Municipal Governments throughout the Midwest to help them in planning, implementing, and expanding their GIS.

Esri Mobile Solutions in ArcGIS 10

Mobile devices are one of the fastest growing technologies. Because of this, leveraging mobile technology in your GIS is more important than ever. You might be wondering how you can quickly get data collected in the field back into your GIS or how to make your GIS more accessible by mobile devices. This workshop will start with a high level discussion of the different mobile technologies available from Esri. We will focus on ArcGIS Mobile and ArcGIS for iOS, Android, and Windows Phone. During the workshop, you will build your own mobile project for ArcGIS Mobile and you will use ArcGIS.com to create a map that can be consumed in an iOS or Android application. This workshop will also discuss web application development patterns that are most appropriate for mobile devices. To get the most out of the workshop, participants are encouraged to bring an Apple iPhone, iPod Touch, iPad, Android or Windows Phone, preferably with the appropriate Esri app already installed.

Understanding Legal Descriptions: Why, What, and How?

1:00 P.M. - 4:00 P.M.

This session is designed as an introductory workshop for persons desiring to read and locate property according to a deed or other legal conveyance. The workshop will include both lecture and exercises. Students will learn to plot land descriptions by Rectangular Survey and Metes & Bounds. There will be instruction on the use of the engineers scale and the use of a land compass. Students will need to bring a 3-sided engineer scale, eversharp pencil, 300/600 and 450/900 triangles, land measure compass (similar to a Pronto Land Compass where N & S are 00 and E & W are 900).

Presenter: Susan R. Williams, PKM, KGISD

Susan began working for the State of KS, Department of Revenue, Property Valuation Division in Feb. of 1986. She served as a Regional Cartographer assisting 25 KS counties through the Reappraisal Program, participated in the development and instruction of all PVD mapping courses, and worked as the GIS Coordinator from '93 - '95 for the division. Her specialties include cadastral mapping, photography, and GIS. Susan is a charter member of KAM and has served as President, Treasurer, Education Chair, and Legislative Chairwoman. Previous to her work in KS, she worked for Webster County, MO as a Deputy Assessor where she created, and then maintained the County's ownership maps.

Types of Deeds and Documents

This class will identify methods of transferring title to real estate. We will cover warranty deeds, special warranty deeds, non probate transfers, judicial transfers and other ways to vest title.

Presenter: David Townsend, President, CEO, Agents National Title Insurance Co

Mr. Townsend is the author of the Missouri Bar Insurance Practice Series: "Title Insurance". Named the Missouri Land Title Young Title Professional for 2009, David is married to Kerry Townsend, has one daughter, Blair and one son, Charlie, and lives in Columbia, Missouri.

GIS in the Mass Appraisal World: A State Perspective

This presentation will cover how the State of Arkansas utilizes GIS in parcel mapping and agricultural audits.

Presenters: Debra Asbury and Robert McGee, Arkansas Assessment Coordination Department

Debra Asbury, Executive Director of Assessment Coordination for the State of Arkansas, was born and raised in Edina, MO. She lived on the Missouri farm until moving to the fast-paced, bright lights and big city of Little Rock, Arkansas for a position with the Pulaski county Assessor's Office. However, one of Debbie's first jobs as a young woman was in Chesterfield, MO with Surdex Mapping Corporation. Debbie is still a girl true to her Missouri roots, especially when she is cheering on her world-famous St. Louis Cardinals.

Debbie is a mother of three: Amber (33), Kaleena (28), and Jakob (19), one ornery son-in-law Tony and three beautiful grandchildren. Logan, Noah, and Ava make her a very proud Grandma, but Debbie has many professional accomplishments, including helping to start the County Assessor Mapping Program (CAMP) which was given special recognition by Esri in 2003 and MAGIC in 2006. She is also the current President-Elect for IAAO, and will become the IAAO President in 2012. Debbie is very active in her community and strives to be a credit in the Assessment world.

PRESENTATIONS

Robert McGee spent over sixteen years in the golf industry out of Mississippi State University's Golf and Sports Turf program with his final 8 years as a Golf Course Superintendent in Missouri and Arkansas. Robert has spent the last six years working for the State of Arkansas' Assessment Coordination Department as their Agricultural Specialist, Oil and Gas Specialist, and GIS Technician. However, he does admit to missing the sunrises and sunsets that came with his old office. Robert has been married to his lovely wife, April, for twenty years, and they have three wonderful children: Darby (15), Jackson (13), and Kenzie (9).

If Rome wasn't built in a day - just how long did it really take?

MSDIS isn't the new Rome - but it can't be rebuilt in a day either! New hardware, new (bleeding edge) software, new procedures, new data services, new imagery services. These services are or will be at your beck and call. Mark will discuss how these new services are already making a difference around the state during disaster event responses such as 2011 Southeast Missouri Spring flooding and the May Joplin tornadic event.

Presenter: Mark Duewell, MSDIS Program Manager

Mark Duewell retired from the U.S. Air Force in 1994 as part of Whiteman Air Force Base's B-2 Stealth program. He served in intelligence (Mapping) and communications - logging two overseas tours - one of which was during Desert Storm. Upon retirement he was employed by the MO Department of Health and Senior Services where he built one of the larger state health GIS programs. In 2003, he accepted a position with the Missouri Spatial Data Information Service (MSDIS) within the University of Missouri's Geographic Resource Center (GRC), Department of Geography. As MSDIS' Program Manager, Mark's role is to widen GIS usage in the state by making data more readily available to all via the state's geospatial data clearinghouse, and improve the services that MSDIS provides to its customers. His current primary concern is the rebuilding of MSDIS to include Geo Portal and Image Server functionality.

Kansas Association of Mappers (KAM) Professional Designations

This session will discuss the different designations KAM has available, what they represent, how to obtain them, and what is required to maintain them.

Presenter: Pamela Cannon, Kansas Association of Mappers

Pamela Cannon has been a member of the Kansas Association of Mappers organization (KAM) since 1999. She is co-chair of the Designation Committee, and serves on the Executive Board of Directors. She earned the Professional Kansas Mapper (PKM) designation in 2007, and received the KAM Prestigious Cartographer award in 2009. She is the GIS Administrator for Linn County, Kansas.

PRESENTATIONS

Regional GIS Data Acquisition Process

This presentation will show how the GIS committee of the Region "A" RHSOC went through a two phase process to obtain Regional GIS data from the RFP to deployment. Mark will discuss the software and hardware that was purchased, the regional training that occurred, and how this process was planned to be deployed in the case of a disaster. He will show how this solution was used in the Sedalia Tornado in May 2011, and how the data and the software was used in the field to develop damage assessments using these new tools and creating Geo PDFs for Incident command to use in the recovery efforts.

Presenter: Mark Allen, Lafayette County, Missouri

From 2000 - 2007, Mark was the GIS/Data Controller for the City of Higginsville, where the main emphases were on utility mapping and gathering GPS data on all attributes of the electric, water, and sewer infrastructure. He is currently the GIS/IT Coordinator for Lafayette County, Missouri. Working for the Assessor's Office, his responsibilities include managing and assisting the Assessor's Office in updating the GIS data system and administrating a 45 workstation computer network, a GIS website, and a County website. Mark is also Chairman of the GIS Committee and the Interoperability Committee for the Region "A" RHSOC.

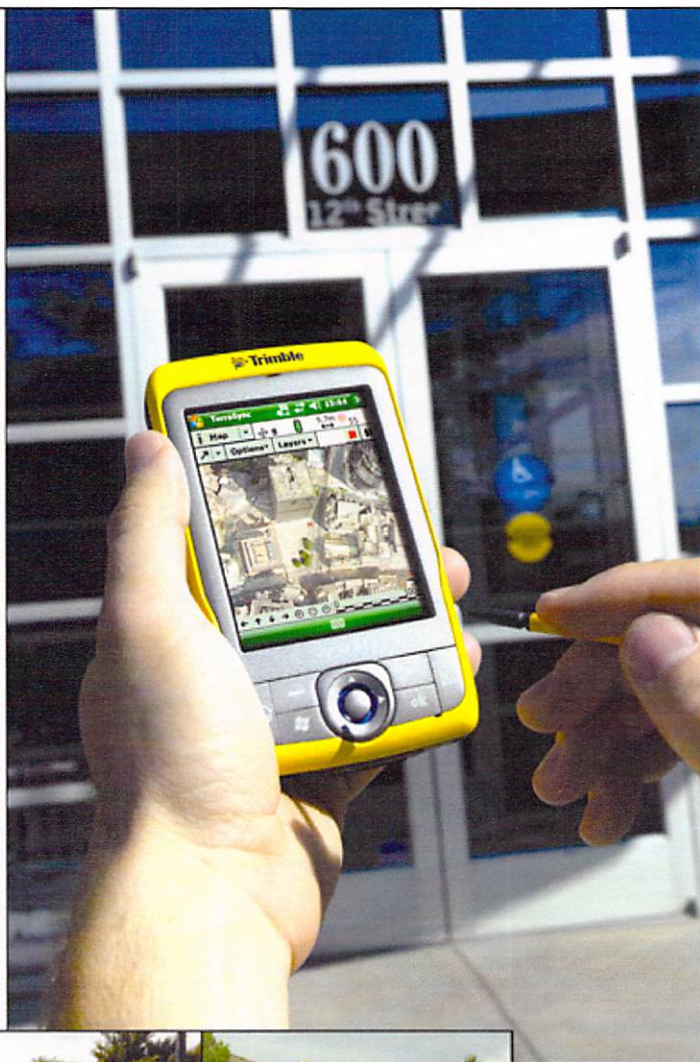

Constitution of the Missouri Mappers

The name of this organization shall be the Missouri Mappers Association. Its purpose is to bring together those persons involved in the mapping profession in the state and local governments and private industry without regard to the unit of government or department in which such persons perform their duties. The Association shall be non-profit and any dues or other funds shall be used to further the objectives of the Association.

Article I - Objectives

Section 1: To create a frame work in which the various governmental units of Missouri and others may cooperate in the investigation, study, discussion, and recommendation of improvement in property mapping and land record management.

Section 2: To provide a forum in which officials of various agencies of state and local governments and others concerned with property mapping may address common problems.

Section 3: To provide a means whereby property mappers and other interested in property mapping may interchange ideas and experiences and obtain advice.

Section 4: To advance property mapping knowledge and practice through education.

Section 5: To encourage a high standard of experience as a means to more effectively serve the public.

Section 6: To work toward the improvement of the technical quality of property maps available to the government.

Section 7: To support legislation beneficial to property mappers and land record management.

Article II - Membership

Section 1 Regular Members: Mappers, mapping supervisors, department heads in charge of mapping, and those directly involved shall be entitled to regular membership.

Section 2 Subscribing Members: Persons or firms not eligible for regular membership that are interested in property mapping.

Section 3 Student Members: Students at a university, college, trade or other equally recognizable school, not eligible for regular membership that is interested in property mapping.

Section 4 Rejection: The right to reject any application for membership is hereby reserved for the Executive Committee.

Section 5 Voting Rights: The right to hold office and vote is open to all members in good standing, with the exception of student members.

Section 7 Transfer of Membership: Whenever the dues of a member are paid by the employer, and the member resigns, retires or otherwise vacates the position during the period for which the dues have been paid; the membership may be transferred to the successor upon receipt of written notice to the Association by said employer.

Article III - Officers

Section 1 Selection: At each annual meeting there shall be elected for a one (1) year term a President-Elect and a Secretary by the membership in good standing who are present. A Treasurer shall be elected every other year for a two (2) year term by the membership in good standing who is present at the annual meeting. Two Directors shall serve on the Executive Board. One Director shall be elected every year for a two (2) year term by the membership in good standing who are present at the annual meeting so that one Director is elected every other year. The President-Elect will automatically assume a one (1) year term of President at the expiration of the President's term.

Section 2 Executive Committee Members: The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, the President-Elect, the Immediate Past President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Directors. The President shall be the chairperson of the Executive Committee and may call a committee together in the interest of the Association at his or her discretion or upon the written request of three (3) committee members. The governing body of the Association shall be Executive Committee and it shall have the power to pass any resolution or bylaw it may deem necessary to accomplish the objectives of the Association which is not in conflict with any of the revisions of this constitution or resolutions or bylaws adopted in meeting of the Association. The Executive Committee shall approve the budgets for all committees, and these budgets shall not exceed

without the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 3 Quorum: For the purpose of transacting official business, a quorum of the executive Committee shall consist of not less than four (4) members thereof.

Section 4 Vacancy of Offices: Whenever a vacancy in the Executive Committee shall occur, the Nominating Committee shall appoint a voting member in good standing to fill the vacancy, which shall serve until the next annual meeting, providing when a vacancy occurs in the office of the President, the President-Elect, shall immediately succeed thereto.

Section 5 Compensation: Officers and Directors shall serve without compensation, except the reasonable expense to attend special meetings, may be approved by the Executive Committee.

Article IV - Duties of Officers

Section 1 President: The President shall be the Chairperson at all general association meetings and executive meetings and executive committee meetings, or designate the President-Elect, in his or her absence or another member of the Executive Committee. The President shall have power to appoint regular or special committees as he or she may deem necessary.

Section 2 President-Elect: The President-Elect shall exercise all the powers and duties of the President during his absence or inability to act and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Executive committee. The President-Elect shall also act as coordinator of the Committees.

Section 3 Secretary: The Secretary shall keep roll of all members of the Association and a true up-to-date record of all proceedings of the Association and meeting of the Executive Committee, subject to the inspection and approval of the Executive Committee, which shall be turned over to his or her immediate successor in office.

Section 4 Treasurer: The Treasurer shall be the chief financial agent of the Association and shall exercise such authority and perform such duties of the Association as may be prescribed by the Executive Committee. The Treasurer shall have custody of all funds, securities, and legal instruments of the Association and shall be responsible for their safe keeping. To this end the Treasurer may, subject to approval of the Executive Committee, determine the place and manner of depositing and safekeeping of such funds, securities, and legal instruments. A correct account of all receipts and distributions must be kept and a complete up-to-date report submitted at each annual meeting. The Executive Committee shall have full rights to examine and cause an audit to be made at any time.

Section 5 Directors: The Directors shall help guide the Association to achieve its objectives by their involvement in the Executive Committee. They shall serve on the Executive Committee with the same voting rights as the other officers.

Article V - Nominations and Elections

Section 1: The President shall appoint each year a Nomination Committee consisting of three (3) voting members in good standing that shall select at least one (1) name from the membership, in good standing, as a candidate for each office and make the necessary report at each annual meeting.

Section 2: Additional nominations for each office may be made from the floor at any annual meeting by any voting member in good standing.

Section 3: Officers shall be elected by majority vote at the annual meeting.

Article VI - Meetings

Section 1: The Association shall hold its annual General meetings at which time the election and installation of officers shall take place. The Executive Committee shall have authority to call special meetings at such time as it deems necessary.

Section 2: Notice of the annual and any special meetings shall be given to all members by mail, not less than 15 days prior to such meetings. Notice shall state the date, time and place of the meeting, along with an agenda of business to be conducted.

Section 3 Quorum: Any business, including the election of officers, can be transacted by a majority of the voting membership in good standing who are present.

Article VII - Amendments

Section 1: This constitution may be amended by a majority vote of all voting members in good standing present and

voting at the annual meeting, provided that notice and a copy of any proposed amendment shall have been sent to all members by mail, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to such meetings.

Section 2: All proposed amendments shall be submitted to the Executive Committee for its review, no later than 60 days in advance of the annual meeting.

Article VIII - Definition of "PROPERTY MAPPING"

PROPERTY MAPPING is the compilation or representation of cadastral information from the primary sources of deeds, surveys, plats, and base maps for the purpose of creating a graphic representation of land ownership, within a governmental unit for assessments, zoning or other purposes.

The information developed from property mapping may be used as a basis for further investigation into primary sources of deeds, plats, and surveys, but does not serve as a substitute for the primary sources of cadastral mapping.

The By-Laws of the Missouri Mappers Association

1. Committees

The following committees shall be appointed by the President each year.

- A. Membership Committee
- B. Education Committee
- C. Publication Committee
- D. Legislative Committee
- E. Certification Committee
- F. Annual Meeting Committee
- G. Awards Committee
- H. IT Committee
- I. Historical Committee

All Committee Chairs are encouraged to attend Executive Committee Meetings and to submit reports to the President and Executive Board of committee activity upon request.

2. Annual Dues

The annual dues shall be \$15.00 for regular members, \$25.00 for subscribing members, and \$5.00 for student members.

3. Time of Annual Meeting

The Association's Annual Meeting shall be held at the discretion of the Executive Committee.

4. Fiscal Year

The Association's fiscal year shall begin on January 1 and end on December 31.

5. Approve of Expenditures

All Association expenditures shall be approved by the President and Treasurer.

6. Chapters

The Association, with the approval of its Board of Directors, may authorize and charter local chapters, consolidate chapters or revoke chapter charters for good cause. Chapters shall be coextensive in geographical area. Application for the charter of a chapter shall be in writing, signed by not fewer than ten (10) members in good standing, and shall be submitted to the Board of Directors of the Missouri Mappers Association for its approval.

Such local chapters may provide for their internal government and regulations by Bylaws which shall not be in conflict with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Association and which shall be submitted to the Board of Directors of the Association for its approval.

Each local chapter is required to have its chairperson or a chapter member, as designated by the chairperson of such chapter, in attendance at each quarterly meeting and give a report to the Board of Directors.

7. Amendments

These Bylaws may be amended by vote of the Executive Committee, as provided by Article III, Section 2, of the Constitution.

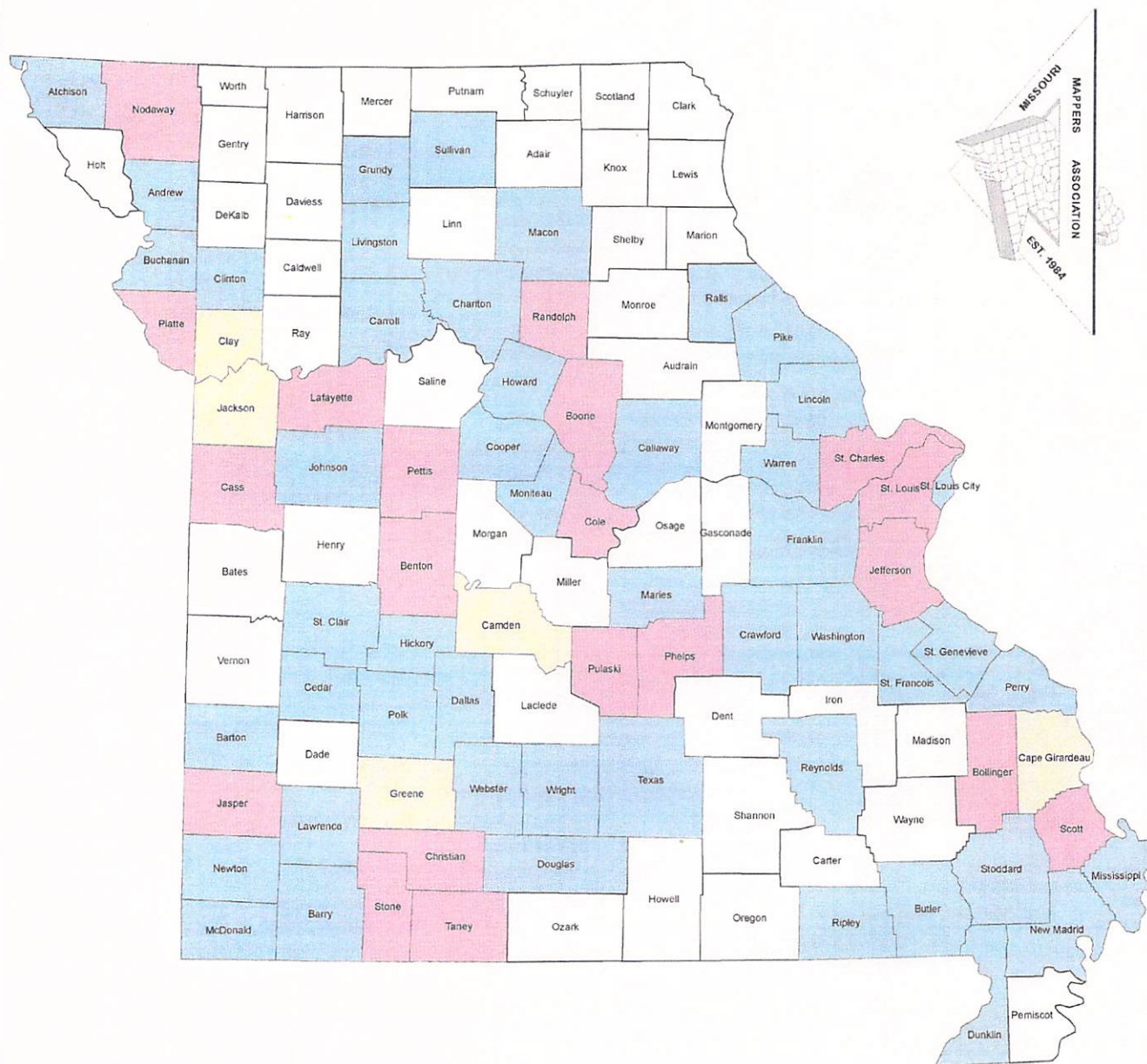
